

Annual survey on maritime transport 2011

This release presents the data on passengers and goods carried in the maritime transport passenger and tonnes miles the data on inventory state of ships at the end of the year as well as number of employees at the end of year.

Number of passengers transported by maritime in 2011 compared with 2010 indicate an increase of 0.8%.

Goods transported by maritime in 2011 compared with 2010 indicate an decrease of 36.7%.

Graph 1. Annual indices of passengers and goods transport

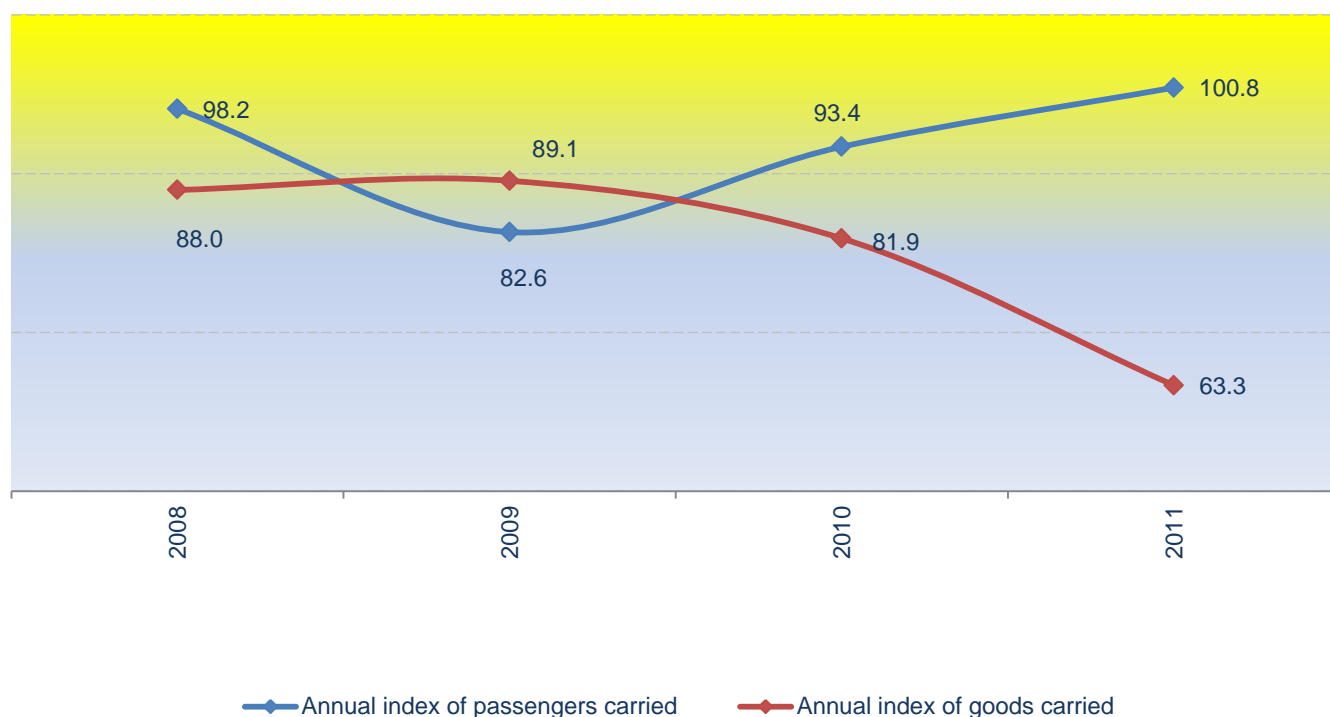

METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

Source of data

The data on maritime transport are the result of annual surveys on reporting units with the sea transport of goods and tonne-miles, as well as export and import in port as the main activity.

Coverage

The surveys cover enterprises classified within the Classification Unit Register by Activity Classification in Section H (Transport and storage). Area 50.

Definitions

Traffic volume is the sum of the quantities of goods from the inner-unloading operations, exports and imports.

Exports include goods loaded in domestic ports and sent overseas to domestic or foreign ships, regardless of the origin of goods.

Imports of goods includes domestic and foreign ships, arrived from abroad in domestic ports, irrespective of the origin of goods.

Transit is the transportation of goods to domestic and foreign ships in the waterway of a foreign country, through our country, in another foreign country.

Transportation between foreign ports, the transport of goods on vessels under our flag, and that without going through our territorial waters.

Passenger ships are vessels with its own propulsion devices that can simultaneously carry more than 12 passengers.

Cargo ships are vessels intended for freight. There are should include tankers.
