Marriages and divorces in Montenegro

2021 year

Statistics of marriages aims to produce data that allow basic demographic analysis of population at the level of Montenegro and municipalities. The data are the basis for the calculation of a series of analytical demographic indicators.

In 2021 in Montenegro were 3 196 marriages and 768 divorced.

The number of marriages in 2021 is 57.7% higher than in the 2020. The statistics of marriages in 2021 show lower number of divorces by 2.0% compared to 2020.

Chart 1. Marriages and divorces, 2011-2021

• In the observed period, the highest number of marriages was in 2013 when there were 3 847 marriages, while the highest number of divorces was in 2018 when there were 849 divorces.




Chart 2. Marriages and divorces by municipalities, 2021

- The higest number of marriages by municipalitis is in Podgorica 1 050 while the smallest is in Savnik only 2 marriages.
- In Podgorica were the higest number of divorced 313 marriages, while there are no divorces in Andrijevica, Pluzine and Savnik.




Chart 3. Marriages and divorces by months, 2021

Wedding month is August. In August, there were 493 marriages which is 15.4% of the total number of marriages.

The largest number of divorces occurred in November (98)

The average age of bride at the first marriage was 28 years, and for a groom 31 years.

Of the total number of marriages:

- For 92.6% of brides (2 961) and 89.9% of grooms (2 874) it was first marriage;
- For 5.9% of brides (190) and 8.5% of grooms (272) it was second marriage;
- For 0.3% of brides (11) and 0.6% of grooms (18) it was third and over marriage.
- There were no information about previous marital status for 1.1% (34) brides and 1.0% (32) grooms




Chart 4. Divorces by duration of mariages, 2021

The average duration of divorces was 12 years.

- Of the total number of divorces 2.2% of divorces was in the first year of marriage;
- 48.8% of divorces lasted 1 to 9 years;
- In the period of 10-19 years there was 27.9% divorces;
- 21.1% were divorces after 20 and more years of duration.

At the moment of divorce average age of wives was 38 and 42 of husbands. In 2021, the higest number of divorces are divorces with children, 438 or (57.0%) divorces, 327 or (42.6%) marriages of the total number of divorces make divorces without children and 3 or (0.4%) marriages unknow. Of the total number of divorces with dependent children in 84.9% of cases there were one or two children and in 15.1% of cases three and more dependent children.

The exercise of parental rights over the higest number of dependent children was entrusted to the mother, or in 75.1% of cases out of the total number of divorces with children 10.7% was entrusted to the father, 11.9% was entrusted to the mother and father, 1.4% to other persons and institution and 0.9% unknow.

METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

Statistics of marriages aim to produce data that allow basic demographic analysis of the population at the level of Montenegro or municipalities. The survey collects data on marriage, as well as basic demographic data on persons who get marriage.

The divorce statistics aims to produce data that allow basic demographic analysis of the population at the level of Montenegro or municipalities. The survey collects data on marriage, basic demographic data on persons who are divorcing and the data on their children.

Data are the basis for calculating the number of analytical demographic indicators used for the purpose of making the analysis of any current or future structure of the population.

Sources of data

Data on marriages are collected by municipality local offices. Data on divorces are collected in courts with jurisdiction over the divorce.

Coverage and comparability

Data on marriages and divorces are collected and processed in accordance with the definition of the total population, according to the international (UN, Eurostat). According to this definition, data on marriages and divorces are processed since 2005. In comparisons of data especially rates should take into account the changing definition of the total population.

According to the regulations on keeping registers cases of marriage should be entered in the register of the area in which they occurred, regardless of whether people live in this area or not. In the analysis of statistical point is done regrouping, so the results reported by residence, and divorces in the last place of common residence.

The statistics of marriages each unit of observation is lawful marriage, and the statistics of divorces every marriage is a final judgment of a competent court divorced.

Definitions and explanations

Marriage is regulated by the law units of husband and wife.

Divorces are the final judgment of a competent court terminated marriage.

Marital status is characteristic for which is taken into account only the legal marital status. This means the married / married persons who considered only the events in the observed occurrence was in a marriage concluded in accordance with legal provisions, and are considered in the divorced person whose marriage is legally dissolved.

Age is expressed in completed years of age. Calculated on the basis of date of birth of persons and the date when the case occurred. In most tables age was reported in the five-year age groups.
