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Pre-primary education and child care

2022/2023

In Montenegro there are 54 pre-primary institutions, out of which 21 institutions are public and 33 are private, with the network of 159 child care units, within which there were organised 829 child care groups.

The total number of children enrolled in pre-primary institutions in school year 2022/2023 is 24 663. Out of the total number of children, there are 47.5% (11 715) of enrolled girls, and 52.5% (12 948) of boys. The share of enrolled children is higher for 7.2% in comparison with the previous school year. Of the total number of children, children enrolled in public institutions account for 95.3%.

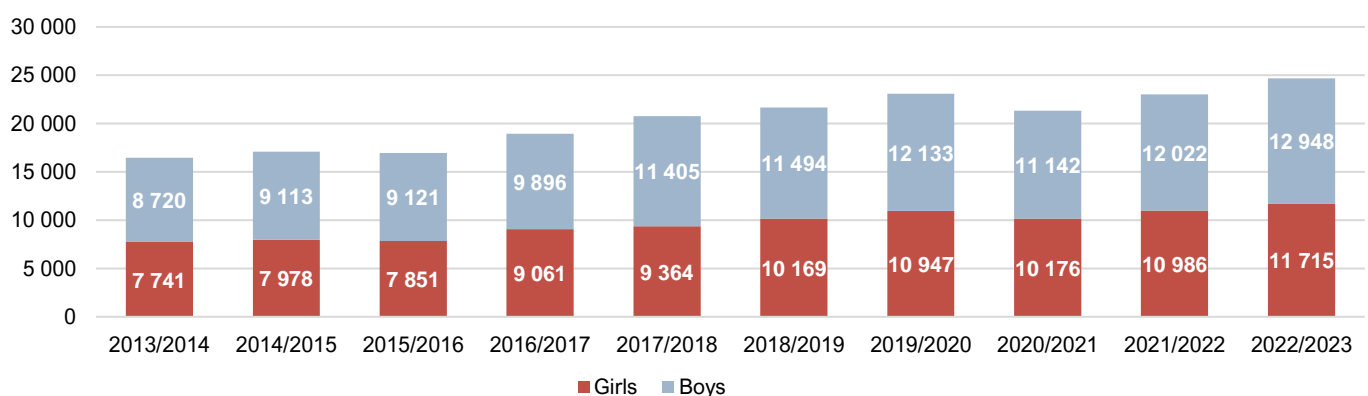
The average number of children per educational group in public pre-primary institution is 32, and in private is the 12.

Of the total number of employees in pre-primary institutions, child-care workers account for 45.8%.

METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

The data on pre-primary education and child care in this release refer to the beginning of school year, and they are results of statistical processing of the Ministry of Education, Science, Culture and Sport.

Data cover all pre-primary educational institutions at the territory of Montenegro (private and public) with the licence for the work obtained from the responsible ministry.

Pre-primary child care and education are a part of uniform education and child care system.

Pre-primary child care and education are performed in accordance with the educational programme of pre-primary education, and it covers children up to the enrolment of primary school.

Pre-primary institutions are: kindergarten, nursery and other institution of pre-primary education which is organized in accordance with appropriate law.

The child care unit is a part of pre-primary institution, out of the main office of institution, covering one or two child care group;

The child care group is a composition of children structured by age, pedagogical norms and number.
