Unit Value Indices (UVI) of exported and imported goods 2010 and 2011

Unit values of goods exported from January to December 2011 increased by 8.8% compared with the same period of previous year, while an increase of 12.2% for period from January to December 2010 compared with the same period in 2009.

From January to December 2011, compared with the same period of previous year, unit values of goods imported increased by 6.7%, while they increased by 5.1% for period January-December 2010 compared with the same period 2009.

From January to December 2011, when observing chapters of customs tariffs, the highest rise of unit value of goods exported of 43.4% was noticed under Chapter 88: Aircraft, spacecraft, and parts thereof, while on side of imported goods, the highest rise of 80% was noticed under Chapter 58: Special woven fabrics; tufted textile fabrics; lace; tapestries; trimmings; embroidery.

In period from January to December 2010, observing chapters of customs tariffs, the highest rise in the export of goods, 75.7% was registered under Chapter 79: Zinc and articles thereof, while the import of goods indicated the highest rise of 69.7% with Chapter 80: Tin and articles thereof.

Graph 1. Growth rate of unit values of goods exported and imported, in %



METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

Unit value indices of exported and imported goods are aimed at analytical measuring the dynamics of unit values of export and import, and they are also used as a deflator in Gross Domestic Product calculation.

The data source for unit value index calculation are collective customs declarations on export and import of goods which are monthly transmitted to Statistical Office of Montenegro by Customs Administration of Montenegro, and used for regular statistical survey in the foreign trade of Montenegro.

Indices of exported and imported prices are calculated as Unit Value Indices (UVI), i.e. changes indices of export and import values per quantity unit of products exported and imported, i.e. per kilogram as a standard and comparable quantity unit for all products.

Indices are calculated by Fisher formula, as an arithmetic average between Laspeyres and Paasche formulas, i.e.

Laspeyres index = $(\sum p_1 * q_0 / \sum p_0 * q_0) * 100$,

Paasche index = $(\sum p_1 * q_1 / \sum p_0 * q_1) * 100 i$

Fisher index = √Laspeyres * Paasche

Where:

p₀ unit value from previous period, p₁ unit value from current period, q₀ quantity from previous period and q₁ quantity from current period.

Relations of exchange are relations between export and import of unit values.

Processing excludes products with the value under 1 000 EUR, where is unit value of current year twice or more higher in comparison with previous year and vice versa, where is the quantity of current year 10 times or more higher in comparison with previous year and vice versa.

The data are presented by chapters of customs tariff, i.e. Harmonised system of names and codes of goods.
